1	UKZN Law Clinic Durban	<ul> <li>1.Ilt is not always possible to have a one-on-one consult between student and client given the large number of students.</li> <li>2.This is heightened when clients fail to turn up, therefore resulting in a simulation being done</li> </ul>
2	Univen Law Clinic	Lack of infrastructure and shortage of staff, facilities to accommodate students, and lack of interest from other colleagues to help facilitate activities.
3	Nelson Mandela Metropolitan University Law Clinic	<ul> <li>1. ILack of resources – computers, adequate telephone services and budgets, finances in general;</li> <li>2. ILack of office – and consultation spaces for all students at relevant times; and</li> <li>3. ILack of staff – additional support- and administrative staff, as well as professional staff members.</li> </ul>
4	North West University Community Law Centre	The number of students has been increasing every year which has made it strenous to run the in house live client model. Ratio of students per supervisor very high.
5	Rhodes University Law Clinic	Resources: Not enough functioning PC's. No wifi, so students often have to work on campus.
6	UCT Law Clinic	Students don't attend lectures. Always busy with the core courses and hampered by how much hours legal practice takes. Not enough drafting built into existing curriculum. Inviting "relevant" professionals can be problematic from an administrative point of view.
7	University of Johannesburg Law Clinic	Too many students; too few attorneys; no messenger; attoreys are expected to act as messengers and do all court appearances as well as attending to the students and clients; no sustainable funding model for the Law Clinic's running expenses.
9	North West University Law Clinic	Limited time that can be spent with students due the students' time tables.
10	University of Pretoria Law Clinic	None.
11	UWC Legal Aid Clinic	Received more than 100 applications for the elective, Legal Process, however only 60 students can enrol for the elective.
12	Wits Law Clinic	Staff/student ratio
13	Legal Aid Clinic - Stellenbosch University	Enough hands to properly supervise students. Convincing the Law Faculty and law students of the importance of this subject.

19	Walter Sisulu University Law Clinic	Shortage of staff to run the programme. Not enough literature in the library to do research. Lack of telephone and internet connections. No transport for outreach programmes.
