1	UKZN Law Clinic Durban	<p>The ratio of supervisor to student capacity is very limited.</p> <p>In estates involving property transfers, there is not much that the clinic can do except to advise the client.</p> <p>Both the Director and the Principal Attorney are full-time lecturers who divide their time between the clinics responsibilities and lecture loads.</p>
2	Univen Law Clinic	<p>Funding.</p> <p>We are highly affected as we are unable to meet all our desired orijects, including equipping our students with a better practical understanding of what is required of them in the profession.</p>
3	Nelson Mandela Metropolitan University Law Clinic	<p>none</p>
4	North West University Community Law Centre	<p>Shortage of staff.</p>
5	Rhodes University Law Clinic	<p>Human Resource Funding.</p>
6	UCT Law Clinic	<p>No funding for indigent peoples' matters.</p> <p>No candidate attorneys.</p> <p>Sheriff accounts and Windeed– constant administrative problems related to payment with the result that they sometimes refused to serve unless paid. Payment done via financial office.</p>
7	University of Johannesburg Law Clinic	<p>We do not have a budget to assist clients with disbursements.</p> <p>Any case requiring experts cannot be done properly as the clients do not have money to pay experts.</p> <p>There are too few attorneys appointed to deal effectively with the number of students and do their own court appearances.</p> <p>We do not have a messenger.</p>
9	North West University Law Clinic	<p>Budgetary constraints – running costs, telephone, sheriff's fees, travelling, etc.</p>
10	University of Pretoria Law Clinic	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Demand outstrips capacity (certain times of the year). 2. Non-permanency of staff members leads to turnover in staff. 3. Lack of clear career path.
11	UWC Legal Aid Clinic	<p>Funding, Resources and Capacity. There is not enough skilled staff to do human rights related litigation. We still operate like a general practice. Quantity rather than quality due to funder demands.</p>
12	Wits Law Clinic	<p>Large student numbers create problems</p> <p>The demands of the University to conduct research and publish impacts not only on the provision of legal services, but also causes tensions between clinicians</p> <p>If more funding could be available, we would be able to assist more.</p>
13	Legal Aid Clinic - Stellenbosch University	<p>Finding financial support for salaries.</p>
14	UFS Law Clinic	<p>The lack of funding and therefore personnel makes it very hard to provide legal services.</p>
